Fine Piping for Highland Dancing

The Simon Fraser University Pipe Band strives for excellence in all its endeavours, and the band's many competition successes across North America and Scotland stand as tribute to the band's ability to play good music. A good measure of the band's success is rooted in the strength of its individual members, who have also left their mark at competitions at home and abroad.

For a number of years the pipers from the Simon Fraser University Pipe Band have been in demand as dance pipers at highland dancing competitions in Canada and the United States. Members of the band have played for many major highland dancing competitions including the Canadian Interprovincial Championships, the United States National Championships, and local and regional championships in both countries.

This recording features four of the band's best dance pipers and represents the high standard of playing for which the Simon Fraser University Pipe Band has become so well known.

#### Terry Lee



Pipe Major Terry Lee has led the Simon Fraser University Pipe Band to five prize-winning finishes in the World Pipe Band Championships in the past six years, taking second prize three times. Under his direction, the band also won the North American Championships in 1982. Terry's success, however, is not limited to pipe bands. He has won many prizes both as a solo piper and a highland dancer, including the MacCrimmon Memorial Cairn for piobaireachd. As a dancer, Terry was a three-time winner of the Braemar Shield. His strength in both piping and dancing led Terry to record his own album of highland dancing, and although no longer available it remains a favourite with dancers and teachers.

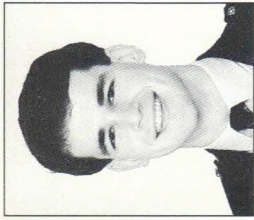
#### Jack Lee



Jack Lee is the pipe sergeant of the band, and ranks among the very best pipers in the world, having won the Highland Society of London's Gold Medal at Inverness. Jack is also a two-time winner of the Former Winners' Silver Star for march, strathspey, and reel playing. His well-known strength in traditional music is featured on many of the highland dances on this recording. Jack has piped for dancing for many years since his own days as a dancer, and most recently played for the 1990 Canadian Interprovincial Championships.

#### Bruce Woodley

Bruce Woodley joined the Simon Fraser University Pipe Band at the age of 15, and his remarkable career as a solo player took off soon after. Bruce has won many prizes in Canada and the United States, and has been a consistent prize winner in Scotland, having taken prizes at Cowal, Oban, and in the Silver Medal at Inverness. Bruce is an experienced dance piper, and plays regularly at competitions and championships in British Columbia.



#### Iain MacDonald

Although originally from Saskatchewan where he now lives, Iain MacDonald moved to Vancouver in 1985 to play with the S.F.U. band. He established himself as a strong competitor often in the prize list, and was a finalist in the British Columbia Pipers' Association Knockout Contest in 1989. Iain has been piping for dancing for just over twenty years and has played for many competitions, including the Saskatchewan Provincial Championships and the 1990 Canadian Interprovincial Championships.



#### Estelle Clewes

The highland dancer in the cover photograph is Estelle Clewes of Coquitlam, British Columbia. In 1990 Estelle won the Commonwealth, All England, and Overseas Championships (under 16); was first runner up in the Canadian Interprovincial Championships (under 16); and placed fourth in the World Championships (under 16).
